



Regional Gathering of the Native Lands and Wilderness Council

This year marks the 30-year anniversary of the Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes' (CSKT) designation of the Mission Mountain Tribal Wilderness. To celebrate this important environmental accomplishment the Center for American Indian Policy and Applied Research (CAIPAR) in partnership with CSKT and the WILD Foundation will bring together indigenous land managers from North and South America – members of the international Native Lands and Wilderness Council (NLWC). The gathering will be held on September 5-7, 2012 at Salish Kootenai College with two days of plenary sessions and break-out sessions focused on land and marine conservation issues. Participants will have the opportunity to enjoy a day of guided interactive experiences in the Mission Mountain Tribal Wilderness on September 5th. This symposium is open to the public.
